

Managing an allegation against a childminder, assistant, visitor, or volunteer who works with children, or a person who lives in a home-based setting

An allegation may relate to a person who works with children who has...

- behaved or may have behaved in a way that indicates they may not be suitable to work with children

- behaved towards a child or children in a way that indicates they may pose a risk of harm to children

- possibly committed a criminal offence against or related to a child

- behaved in a way that has harmed a child, or may have harmed a child

If you are not sure if your allegation or concern falls within the definition above, we strongly advise you contact the LADO for further guidance

An allegation or concern is raised or emerges regarding a childminder, assistant, volunteer, or person who lives in a home-based setting



The registered childminder will record all the details
They should not investigate the allegation

The designated senior manager must contact the Local Authority Designated Officer (LADO) within one working day. They will discuss with the LADO and establish next steps; a referral form may be required

The LADO will gather information and consult with relevant professionals. If threshold is met, the LADO will convene an [Allegations Management Meeting](#)

At the same time, Ofsted should be notified by the registered childminder. Ofsted will decide whether they need to take further action

Throughout the process the Early Years setting must follow the advice of the LADO!
