

Have you dived into the new 'Reading Framework'?


The Reading Framework was published in July 2023 and has a whole host of new information for school leaders and teachers alike. This new publication provides guidance on how reading should be taught in primary schools and helps schools to meet the expectations set out in the Early Years Foundation Stage framework and the national curriculum. It aligns with Ofsted's Education Inspection Framework.

Building on the previous Reading Framework, it now includes guidance on how to develop fluency once children have mastered accuracy and automaticity in work reading. It uses up-to-date research

to support schools in teaching reading in English lessons as well as using reading to promote talk and discussion in other areas of the curriculum. It has a useful section on how to choose and organise books in the school's library, as well as in dedicated reading areas in classrooms. We all acknowledge how difficult it can be to build a whole school culture that values and supports reading for pleasure, but this document has a plethora of ideas on how to 'keep all pupils reading'.

Each section is then followed by an audit document that will promote extensive discussions with all staff on how to embed reading at the heart of the schools' vision.

We will be focusing on the <u>Reading Framework</u> in the autumn term Literacy <u>Subject Leaders' meeting</u> so please come along and join other passionate literacy leaders on unpicking the 'jewels' from this 170 page document.



It's been a busy summer at Grafham Water Centre, with their successful Discovery Club running; places were offered under the Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Scheme and were filled almost every week. Parents urged to apply now for September 2024 school places

The application process for children who need a primary or secondary school place in Peterborough

for September 2024 has started.

Any child transferring from primary school to secondary school next year must apply for a place by 31 October 2023.

Children due to start at primary school next September must complete their application by 15 January 2024.

Parents are encouraged to make applications online. Children starting at primary school will be notified on 16 April 2024. Those applying to secondary school will be offered a place on 1 March 2024.



Are You Claiming Pupil Premium for Your Children Previously in Care?



PP+ allocations for Children Previously in Care (CPiC) are calculated based on the number of eligible pupils recorded by education settings in the October census. Designated Teachers/Persons (DTs) should ensure they have raised awareness of the PP+ by encouraging parents and guardians to tell their setting if their child is eligible to attract PP+ funding. To assist, DTs may wish to adapt and send out a template letter that can be found on our website: Template-Letter-for-PP.docx (live.com) It should be noted that there is no obligation for a parent or guardian to declare their child as 'previously in care' and their wishes must be respected.

Parents/guardians need to demonstrate their child's eligibility for the funding by showing their setting proof of their child's previously in care status. For example, showing a copy of the legal documentation (adoption certificate, SGO or CAO order) which demonstrates that the child was previously looked after by an English or Welsh local authority and has gone on to be adopted, subject to a special guardianship order or a child arrangement order, or a letter from the Local Authority confirming that they placed the child with the parents or guardians. Once this eligibility has been seen by settings, the child can be recorded as 'previously in care' on the October census and their eligibility does not need to be shown again unless the child moves settings.

A14: The evolution of a landscape through time - an interactive ArcGIS-based StoryMap storymap ?

The archaeological excavations of the <u>A14 Cambridge to Huntingdon Road scheme</u> were completed by MOLA Headland Infrastructure (MHI) in 2018. With an emphasis on learning and discovery about the impact of human activity on the landscape, MHI have produced a novel online, interactive, ArcGIS-based vegetation StoryMap - <u>A14: The evolution of a landscape through time (arcgis.com)</u>. More A14 archaeology StoryMaps are due (2024).

This StoryMap stands to be a great tool to use in geography, science, maths, history, IT, art and creative writing classes. With user-friendly storyboards, videos, maps and links to local research, it is a versatile teaching tool.

KS3 Teaching resources from Better Health on vaping

With a rise in the number of children vaping, Better Health have created <u>teaching resources</u> aimed at helping Key Stage 3 children understand the impact vaping has on their physical and mental wellbeing. The three curriculum linked resources feature:

- Information on nicotine, what vaping is and the impact it has
- Films co-created by young people
- Activities to prompt pupil discussion and reflection
- Content written and reviewed by teachers
- Guidance on teaching about vaping
- Flexibility of use as either short form time activities or a full lesson plan
- Endorsement from the NHS





Promoting Oral Health in the Primary School

CCS NHS Trust Oral Health Webinar For Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Primary Teachers

With NHS dentist places being in very short supply, there has never been a more critical time to ensure that the correct oral health messages are being delivered through the curriculum in primary schools.

To coincide with the September Smile Stations, a free 1 hour CPD webinar, has been created by Cambridgeshire Community Services Oral Health Team, to support teaching staff by upskilling and improving confidence in delivering Oral Health Promotion in the classroom. This includes key oral health messages and basic trauma management along with ideas and suggestions on how best to integrate these into lesson planning to ensure national curriculum requirements are met. The presentation will be followed up with a simple toolkit to inform lesson delivery.

All Cambridgeshire and Peterborough schools can apply for a subsidised place (up to 50%) for the September cohort by submitting, alongside the application form, a written statement of up to 500 words on how undertaking the Rainbow Flag Award will benefit the mental health and wellbeing of their LGBTQ+ young people and how they will evidence this through the Student Voice and Pastoral Support sections.

The initial training day for the lead person and a member of SLT will take place in Ely on 20th September and the closing date for applications is 8th September.

PCC SENI Service - Satutory Multi-Agency EHCP Training Programme 2023/24 - Book now!

The Local Area SENI Support (LASS) Team, as part of the SEN and Inclusion (SENI) team, have coproduced a multi-agency rolling programme of training and support for Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) stakeholders and wider partners.

The training programme has had contribution from a range of stakeholders to help identify the areas most needed for development within the different services. The training is free of charge and will run virtually via Microsoft Teams.

Aim of the sessions: To help build confidence, knowledge and better understanding of the statutory processes, specifically around the Annual Review process and the Request for EHC Needs Assessment across all partners, including sharing examples of good practice. To continue to build on the strong communication between services and stakeholders. To improve the SEND provision for children/young people across Peterborough.
