Schools' Allergy Code		
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Peterborough City Council would like to make all schools aware of the 'Schools' Allergy Code'.

The Schools' Allergy Code is a code of practice to help schools to keep pupils with allergies safe. It was created to give schools a set of standards and clear guidance to help make their settings as safe and inclusive as possible. Any school can sign up to the Code and use the associated checklist to ensure it is following best practices.

The link below includes a video clip lasting less than 4.5 minutes, which explains more about the code. We encourage all Headteachers, Safeguarding leads and Chairs of Governors to take a few minutes to watch the clip. Schools signing up to the code will have access to newsletters and webinars to support staff in this area. The code has the support of clinicians and the Director of Public Health for Peterborough and Cambridgeshire.

Specialist Qualification for Primary PE Subject Leaders

The recent Ofsted Physical Education '<u>Levelling the Playing Field'</u> document identified the need for greater rigour in the leadership of Primary School PE.

For over a decade now, Cambridgeshire's PE Advisory Service has delivered the Level 6 Primary PE Subject leadership award. This professionally recognised qualification helps develop a deeper understanding of teachers' role as a physical education (PE) leader, and enhances the ability to design, lead and evaluate a targeted strategy for primary school PE. This qualification has been identified as best practice by DfE, and is regarded as a good use of the PE Premium funding. Supporting care-experienced children - New free teacher training resources from BBC Teach

BBC Teach, the home of thousands of free curriculum-mapped classroom videos, has worked with experts to produce a free teacher resource, <u>Supporting Care Experienced Children</u>. Mathew Blood, Virtual School Head for Islington, is featured in the video resources which aim to raise teachers awareness and increase understanding.

The resource is designed to help teachers understand more about the needs of care experienced children, how a trauma-informed approach can offer support to a traumatised child in a school setting, and ideas for how teachers can take actionable next steps. There are also three powerful animations of first-person testimonies by young adults who have been through the care system.

BBC Teach worked closely with Adoption UK on Supporting Care-Experienced Children. Data from the charity's annual Barometer (2023) shows that the majority of adoptive parents feel that their

school works with them to find the best ways to support their child. However, less than half (44 per cent) feel teachers have a good understanding of the needs of care-experienced children.

Alex Harris, Executive Producer, BBC Teach said: "I hope these resources offer teachers useful and practical information to help them to support care-experienced children and young people. It features first-hand, frank and emotional testimony from young people who've experienced care, as well as advice from some of the UK's leading experts. We know teachers have many pressures on their time, so we have packed a lot of information into the films. We do hope schools will be able to use this resource in training and INSET."

Closes 12 March 2024.

<u>Elective Home Education Guidance -</u> seeking views on proposed changes to the elective home education guidance for local authorities and parents. Closes **tomorrow** (18th January 2024).


