ILACS Inspection is underway in Peterborough

The second half of the autumn term now finds us at the start of a full Ofsted inspection of Local Authority Children's Services.

Peterborough got the call on Monday 20 November and there are now three weeks of intensive work taking place. The link to the framework is



NHS Cambridgeshire and Peterborough provides HEAR – the free to use mental health text service

A new local mental health free text messaging support service is available across Cambridgeshire and Peterborough having launched on the 13^{th} November 2024.

HEAR 85258 is being funded by NHS Cambridgeshire & Peterborough, in partnership with the

national service SHOUT. The free to use text service provides real-time support to people who are struggling with their mental health across the county.

When texting the word HEAR to 85258, the person will be connected to a trained volunteer who will offer them calm in a time or place of crisis. During the confidential and anonymous conversation, the texter will be supported while working on a plan of action and signposted to local and national mental health services.

Texting HEAR to 85258 is free, discreet and runs 24/7. It won't appear on a mobile bill and requires no app, data, password, or registration.

HEAR 85258 is specifically targeted at school staff, students and their families and carers.

DFE Guidance on students attending political protests re The Middle East

The Secretary of <u>State wrote on 17 October</u> to support schools in securing a safe environment for children, young people and staff in the wake of the Israel Hamas conflict.

Since then we are aware of a small number of cases where students have participated in protests related to the Middle East during school time.

While we understand students may have strong feelings related to world events, the Department is clear that missing school to engage in protests is unacceptable.

We strongly support headteachers and local authorities in setting a clear expectation to parents and children that pupils should be in school, and supporting actions taken to ensure attendance.

This includes recognising that absence to engage in this kind of political activity is considered unauthorised. We also encourage schools to work with local authorities where thresholds are met for enforcement activity, including (where applicable) for fixed penalty notices.

Stibbington Centre Legacy: Burwell House Outreach

An exciting new, (but familiar) school trip experience is available from January 2024. Burwell House will be running curriculum-based day visits from Nene Valley Railway and Sacrewell Farm following the closure of Stibbington Centre this summer. This includes the extremely popular WWII Evacuation days, with a new opportunity for a train journey at Nene Valley Railway, and a selection of geography, rivers, and habitat days at Sacrewell Farm. The courses will provide a unique, fun day outside the classroom covering areas of the curriculum which may be challenging to cover in school.



Senior mental health lead training grant update for Cambridgeshire and Peterborough schools 2023/ 2024



More than 40% of Cambridgeshire & Peterborough schools have still NOT claimed their £1,200 grant to train a Senior Mental Health Lead.

NEW Opportunity to claim a second grant if the trained lead has left!

The application process remains the same as the first-time round with one additional step: when completing the online form, the applicant needs to tick the declaration to confirm the previously trained senior mental health lead at the setting has now moved on from the role.
