


Education Leadership Team and School Improvement Team Structure Chart and Contact Details

Trans/Gender Questioning Children Guidance

The government's draft guidance on <u>Gender Questioning Children</u> was published on 19th December and is open for consultation until 12th March 2024. The aim of this document is to provide guidance and practical support for schools and colleges, including supporting children who are questioning their gender, protecting children from bullying or abuse and maintaining child safety and wellbeing. The PSHE Service are running an online course on Exploring Gender on the 27th February, which will cover awareness raising, whole school approaches to challenging stereotypes and supporting trans children. Aspects of the draft Gender Questioning Guidance will be explored.

This professionally recognised qualification helps develop a deeper understanding of teachers' role as a physical education (PE) leader, and enhances the ability to design, lead and evaluate a targeted strategy for primary school PE. This qualification has been identified as best practice by DfE, and is regarded as a good use of the PE Premium funding.
