The Sensory and **Physical** Support Service (SAPS)

- Due to waiting times for Audiology and for ENT surgery, we have noticed a large uptake in referrals for glue ear. Glue ear can affect a high number of young people in Early years and primary settings. You may notice young people coming in with soft bands around their head to aid their hearing. SAPS have a video to aid with understanding around this which can be found in this link: Glue Ear in Children and Young People. Should you require further support the usual referral to the team can be made.
- In the new year, we are looking to follow up our successful program of signing with parents of Deaf children. More details will follow but if you have parents who may benefit, please let you Teacher of the Deaf know.



The Early Years SEND Specialist and Portage Service



- We have been as busy as ever offering our 'Portage model' of home visiting support to our pre-school children with complex developmental needs and their families.
- We are currently running our NAS EarlyBird programme with 8 sets of parents, of children with an Autism diagnosis, and the new materials have had positive feedback.
- Our Sensory Learners group continues to be a vital part of our support package for children and their families.
